





This Voice Of Our Community Study has been developed to help local community leaders and citizens identify the major local patterns. The data that has been captured here can be broadly classified in two categories: (1) The perceptions by the citizens of the community and (2) The numbers that measure the economic facts. The report helps identify the opportunities and the challenges, so that the community can build on what is working. **Our big observation: Please note, the survey only captured**21 local responses. Canton seems to be facing some very dramatic economic and communal headwinds. While these are some very acute challenges, the key opportunity that Canton also faces is to use this moment to inflect it future economics. The local leadership should use this moment to catalyze thoughtful and coordinated efforts that engage/inspire residents.





Key Economic Observations

The survey responders' sense of the current and future economic outlook of the community is very poor. They perceive the current economic conditions (business conditions and employment opportunities) extremely negatively. And while the future outlook is better than the current state assessment, it too is dramatically lower than the perception that the rest of county residents hold for their respective communities.

Why are these results so poor? Although this is small sample pool, is there any validity to this perspective?



Key Economic Observations

Canton's economic outlook looks quite challenging. Critically disturbing is the poor economic condition identified by the survey responders. And further exacerbating this direct response from local survey responders is the data that is collected through national platforms (seen pages 3 and 5). Key data points that are concerning for the community are local population numbers and the school enrollment rates, local tax collection, local poverty rates, local business count, local employment count and local wages. Across all these dimensions Canton is trending flat at best.

The opportunity: never waste a tragedy.

How can this moment be used propel the local leadership and residents to take incremental actions that can help change the direction of Canton?








Portion of the community that is highly confident on the listed community dimensions (Rating range: 0-7; Scored >5)

OVERALL COMMUNITY PERCEPTION

We see a lower level of community confidence being expressed in Canton than an average county resident towards their community. Most concerning are the metrics related to the 'Actions' that are being taken in the community to drive the local agenda. The residents are indicating that they are not seeing a cohesive visioning process for the community. The lowest scores that were shared relate to how the town conducts its planning process. Local leaders should consider if this challenge can be addressed through consistent and proactive communication? Or does this require a deeper level change in how the planning process is conducted in the city.

Challenges identified by local citizens:

Infrastructure: Improved streets, sidewalks, sewage, water treatment

Economic Development: Increased wages














Local Educational Level

School District % Free-Reduced Price Lunch






